Christ is Risen! Alleluia!

"But in fact, Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died." (1 Corinthians 15:20)

I like St. Paul's bold declaration about the resurrection of Jesus. The church in Corinth needed that unwavering conviction as they were struggling with their faith. In a world filled with many voices, experts, analysts, gurus, and cynics; we need a strong voice with a firm conviction. Easter is not just a story from the past; it is the dawn of a new reality. When Christ rose from the grave, He was not just proving His power over death—He was opening the way for all of us to share in His victory. Paul calls Him the **"first fruits"**, the first glimpse of a harvest still to come. That harvest is us—all who belong to Christ, called into the fullness of life with Him.

Our world shows many signs of brokenness. On Easter Day, we renew our baptismal vows because baptism is our share in Christ's death and resurrection. We let go of sin and fear, step into the light, and claim the life He has won for us. The old has passed away; the new has begun.

So, this Easter, let us live as **resurrection people**. Let us not be trapped by the past, weighed down by fear, or discouraged by darkness. Christ is risen, and His rising is our hope. In Him, life conquers death, joy overcomes sorrow, and love reigns forever!

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!
